This year's programme has been designed to challenge and motivate children through a balance of academic and practical activities, giving students numerous opportunities to have a fun but productive summer.




Location Map



Attendance


School starts at 08:30 each day and finishes at 15:00. If arriving late, leaving early or absent, please make sure to call the office in advance. The office will be open from 08:00 and will remain open until 15:30 each day.

<u>Arrival and Pick up times</u>

Children may start to arrive from 08:00 at which time a duty teacher will be at the main school gate. All classes will be met in the playground by their teachers and then taken inside.

Children will be released in the cafeteria at 15:00. All children need to be collected by a specified adult.

Please inform the teacher in the morning if you have made arrangements for your child to be picked up by someone else at the end of the day. The school must be cleared by 15:30 each day as the school site will close.









Lanna International Summer School's goal is to provide a safe place where children can work, learn, and grow, while maintaining a safe, caring and creative environment. 
Water Fun!

Milepost 2 (Years 3 and 4)-Success with Silver The big idea






When we work together and are courageous we can achieve a common goal. There is value in recognising and observing special events through ritual and with joy and happiness. .

Lanna Summer School Schedule (July 2024)	
08:00	Students may begin arriving at the Main Gate (No1) reception area
08.30 to 09.30	 Language arts classes: development of reading, writing, speaking and listening skills to: Develop basic communication skills through phonic and vocabulary acquisition. Raise speaking and listening skills so that students can use English in and outside school. Assist or strengthen verbal pronunciation and intonation, to communicate more clearly and effectively. Develop interpersonal, social and language skills through activities art, sport, science, ICT and play. Develop literacy and raise awareness of spelling and writing and focus on basic grammatical structures. Improve reading skills and introduce students to a richer experience of literature via storytime and Power of Reading sessions. Improve writing skills: giving students the opportunity to explore, learn and use words, building to scaffolded sentences, texts and stories. Introduce students to related science and social studies. For older students, help to raise their command of English and experience international school style classes.

Children are expected to bring their own snack. However, lunch is provided at school each day. Please pack a healthy mid-morning snack and a drink. It is essential that children have plenty of water to drink, so a personal refillable bottle is needed.

What to Wear

Children should wear casual, light summer clothes and light shoes. No additional indoor shoes are needed. Please label all items of clothing.

Every Monday, please make sure your child brings a swimsuit, towel and appropriate wet footwear (Crocs, flip flops, water shoes). Goggles are optional. These will be returned each night for washing.

Lost and Found Items

Please make sure personal belongings are named. At the end of Summer School, we will display any lost and found items. Please understand that any leftover items not claimed will be disposed of.


<u>Parking</u>

Please use the car park to park your vehicle when picking up your child. You will need to pick up your child from the cafeteria and sign them out with your class teacher. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

<u>Fees</u>

All fees must be paid prior to attending the Summer School. These can be paid in cash to the school office or via a bank transfer. Further details can be found on the application form. The fees are structured as follows;

- 32,000 BHT per block including all tuition, lesson resources, activities and lunch for all students.
- 57,600 BHT for 2 blocks including all tuition, lesson resources, activities and lunch for all students.
 - Special Early Bird Discount of 30,000 BHT for one block if you sign up and pay by 17th April or 57,600 BHT for 2 blocks





Lanna International Summer School Important information for Parents



In line with our normal school policy, please be aware that parents are not allowed to take pictures of any children whilst on school premises.

Also, children are not allowed to bring smart watches to Summer School. If they do these will be collected at the start of the day by their teacher and given back at the end of the day. Primary students are not permitted to bring mobile phones into school at any time.


We also ask that parents update us immediately if your contact details change.

Lanna has a firm but fair behaviour/pastoral policy which will be applied to all Summer School students and followed through. Parents are expected to read and go over the behaviour expectations for students and talk to their children before Summer School begins so that students know our expectations and follow them.

Should any student face any challenges with regards to relationships etc whilst attending Summer School we ask parents to inform us immediately so we can act upon any concerns. Do not approach any other student or parents of the student. Any incidents that happen at school will be dealt with following our Pastoral Policy and appropriate sanctions will be applied.

For any student who does not follow our code of conduct there will be appropriate sanctions which could include

- a behavioural log
- talking to parents
- sending home during the day
- rejecting of placement at Summer school-please note that if the decision is to reject the placement there will be no refund of fees paid.





- Students are not permitted to be in classrooms or areas where there is no member of staff at anytime.
- Students are expected to speak in English all the time-this is a universal language which we all speak.
- Students need to follow the Lanna Code of Conduct
 - respect others;
 - respect school property and the property of others;
 - o complete assignments as assigned by the teachers;
 - be prepared with appropriate books and materials;
 - behave in a quiet and orderly manner when moving around the school buildings;
 - o respect community standards regarding displays of affection;
 - respond courteously when talking with fellow students, faculty, staff members and visitors;
 - obey the established rules of the school;
 - o respect the laws and customs of the Kingdom of Thailand, and
 - be a positive representative of Lanna International School in the community.

<u>Playground Behaviour</u>

A safe campus environment for everyone must be maintained in the playground during play times. Students are expected to adhere to the rules and direction of teachers to ensure this.

Ball-games may only be played in the designated areas during the designated times.

Unacceptable behaviour in the playground includes

- rough role play games/play fighting,
- name calling, hitting,
- punching,
- kicking,
- swearing,
- spoiling somebody else's game,
- rudeness to staff,
- answering back,
- verbal abuse
- spitting.

Climbing on anything other than specifically designed climbing apparatus is strictly forbidden.









i.Summer School tuition:

• We ask that you make any cancellations as soon as possible to aid a smooth transition and running of the Summer School programme. Please note that there are no refunds at all of any Summer School fees.

ii. Cancellation of school:

• No refund for any summer-school-related fees in the case of cancellation of school due to extreme events beyond the control of school and its staff.
