Block 3 - International School - 10th July - 28th July.

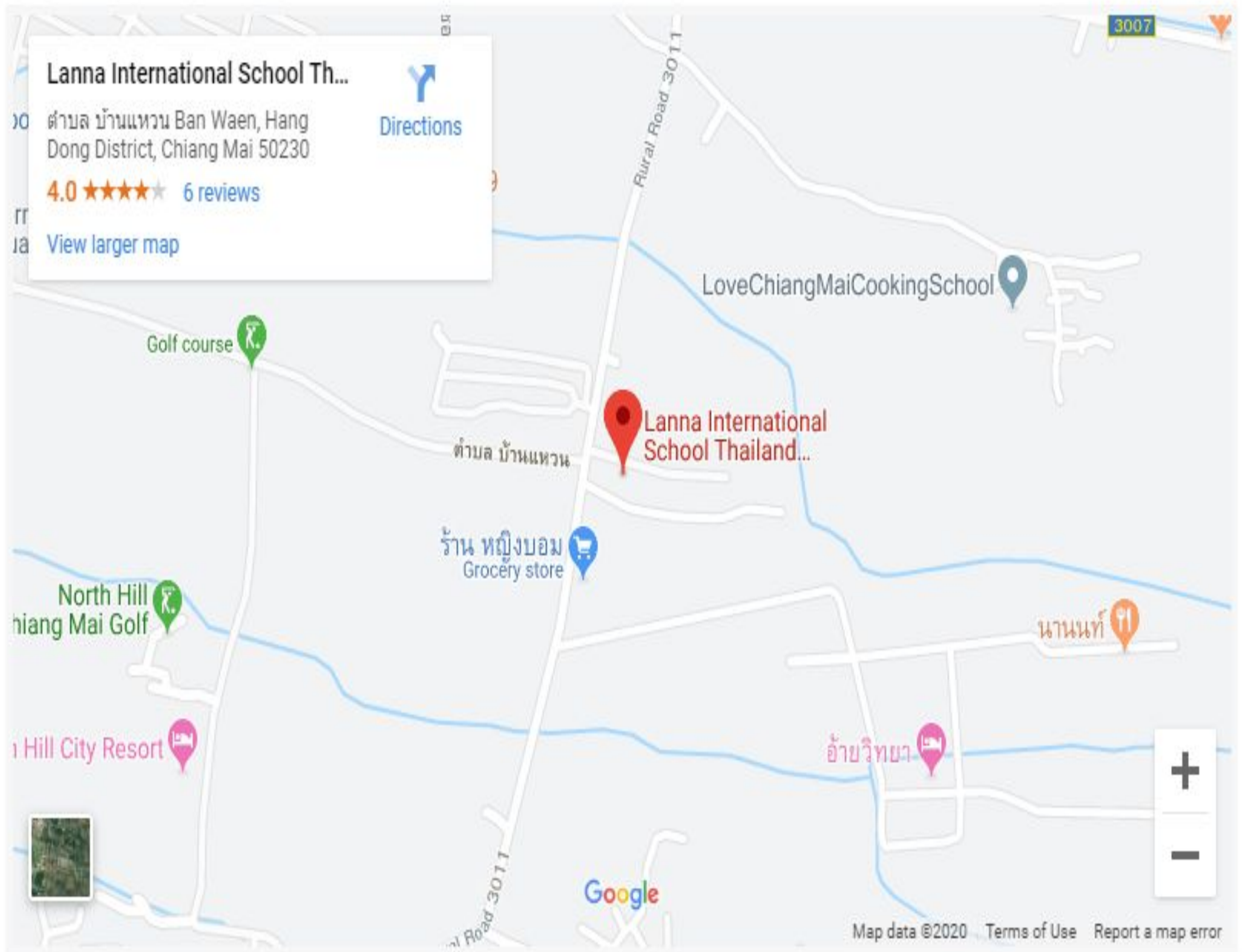
You are welcome to send your child to Blocks 1 and 2 together (for a discounted amount) if you wish, however International Block 3 is only open for International guests.

# General Information

## **Staff**

Summer School staff will consist of experienced qualified experienced teachers and Teacher Assistants. There will be a school nurse and a lifeguard employed during this time to ensure the safety and protection of our students attending summer school at Lanna. Some of the team includes:

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## **Attendance**

School starts at 08:30 each day and finishes at 15:00. If arriving late, leaving early or absent, please make sure to call the office in advance. The office will be open from 08:00 and will remain open until 15:30 each day.

## **Arrival and Pick up times**

Children may start to arrive from 08:00 at which time a duty teacher will be at the main school gate. All classes will be met in the playground by their teachers and then taken inside.

Children will be released in the cafeteria at 14:20. All children need to be collected by a specified adult.

Please inform the teacher in the morning if you have made arrangements for your child to be picked up by someone else at the end of the day. The school must be cleared by 15:00 each day as the school site will close.

If your child stays for the optional ASA programme, pick up time is promptly at 15:20 at the cafeteria.

# Lanna International Summer School Overview

## **Aims and Objectives**

Lanna International Summer School's goal is to provide a safe place where children can work, learn, and grow, while maintaining a safe, caring and creative environment. It will provide an appropriate balance of academic and creative hands-on activities through which children can develop, socially and academically during a summer of fun active learning.

## **Meet the Future!**

All children will be using technology on a daily basis. Despite this, we ask that all students leave their own devices at home.

## **PE & Swimming**

All children will enjoy water fun in our swimming pool and splash pool. As such, each child needs to bring their swimming costumes, towels and sandals on the scheduled swimming days. All swimming items will need to be taken home after use.

## **Summer School Programme**

### **Early Years - Press it, Click It**

#### **The Big Idea**

We can use machines to do lots of things – wash our clothes, cook a meal, take a photograph, play a game, even talk to someone on the other side of the world! We are going to be meeting some very amazing machines and using them in all kinds of exciting ways.

### **Milepost 1 (Years 1 and 2) -Creators and Communicators**

#### **The Big Idea**

In 'Creators and Communicators', we will be learning about how creating and communicating using technology has evolved throughout history and how we can create and communicate using technology and digital media today. In order to develop our knowledge, skills and understanding of this topic, we will need to be creators, communicators, historians and artists. Do we think that technology always allows us to communicate and create better than without it?

### **Milepost 2 (Years 3 and 4)- Inventions That Changed the World**

#### **The Big Idea**

We will be learning about inventions and how they can transform our lives. We will need to be historians and scientists in order to study inventions from the past that have changed our world. Can you think of ways we could use our knowledge to think about current problems and what inventions may be necessary in the future?

### **Milepost 3 (Years 5 and 6)-Fairgrounds**

#### **The Big Idea**

We all know that fairground rides are designed to ignite our senses, through fear, excitement and the unexpected but how does this happen? How are these rides powered in a way which enables them to speed up and slow down at just the right moments, whilst staying on a track that twists upside down?

As technologists and designers, we will use the science behind the rides to create our own fairground rides and games.

### **Milepost 4 (Years 7 and 9)- What Price Progress?**

#### **The Big Idea**

Ever advancing science and technology are transforming the way we live our lives. This is nothing new, but we need to consider how technology meets our needs without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their needs. How will we continue to develop new technologies that are sustainable?

## **Snack Time / Lunch Time**

Children are expected to bring their own snack. However, lunch is provided at school each day. Please pack a healthy mid-morning snack and a drink. It is essential that children have plenty of water to drink, so a personal refillable bottle is needed.

## **What to Wear**

Children should wear casual, light summer clothes and light shoes. No additional indoor shoes are needed. Please label all items of clothing.

At the Primary site, every Monday, please make sure your child brings a swimsuit, towel and appropriate wet footwear (Crocs, flip flops, water shoes). Goggles are optional. These will be returned each night for washing.

## **Lost and Found Items**

Please make sure personal belongings are named. At the end of Summer School, we will display any lost and found items. Please understand that any leftover items not claimed will be disposed of.

## **Parking**

At the Primary site, please use the car park to park your vehicle when picking up your child. You will need to pick up your child from the cafeteria and sign them out with your class teacher. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

## **ECAs**

These are teacher-run extra curricular activities, such as crafts, swimming, PE, coding to enhance our curriculum even further.

## **After School Activities**

We are also running activities after school which are optional, and therefore charged separately. We will release these options before and you can choose what and how often you would like your child to participate. These activities are run by Lanna teachers and outside specialists. ASAs will start at the end of the Summer School day and complete by 3:20.

# Lanna International Summer School Phone Policy

In line with our normal school policy, please be aware that parents are not allowed to take pictures of the children on school premises.

Also, children are not allowed to bring smart watches to summer school. If they do these will be collected at the start of the day by their teacher and given back at the end of the day.
