

This handbook will provide you with information regarding our Summer School programme. It will outline subjects, expectations and general information about this year's programme.


This year's programme has been designed to challenge and motivate children through a balance of academic and practical activities, giving students numerous opportunities to have a fun but productive summer.



Attendance

School starts at 08:30 each day and finishes at 14:00. If arriving late, leaving early or absent, please make sure to call the office in advance. The office will be open from 08:00 and will remain open until 15:00 each day.

Arrival and Pick up times

Children may start to arrive from 08:00 at which time a duty teacher will be at the main school gate. All classes will be met in the playground by their teachers and then taken inside.

Children will be released in the cafeteria at 14:00. All children need to be collected by a specified adult.

Please inform the teacher in the morning if you have made arrangements for your child to be picked up by someone else at the end of the day. The school must be cleared by 14:30 each day as the school site will close.



Lanna International Summer School Overview

Aims and Objectives

Lanna International Summer School's goal is to provide a safe place where children can work, learn, and grow, while maintaining a safe, caring and creative environment. It will provide an appropriate balance of academic and creative hands-on activities through which children can develop, socially and academically during a summer of fun active learning.

Water Fun!

Primary School children (Aged 5-8) will enjoy water fun in our paddling pool and splash area on a daily basis. As such, each child needs to bring their swimming costumes, towels and sandals each day. All swimming items will need to be taken home each day to ensure they are clean for children to use.

Children (aged 9-14) will also enjoy water fun in our swimming pool. As such, each child needs to bring their swimming costumes, towels and sandals on the scheduled swimming days. All swimming items will need to be taken home after use.

Lessons & Activities

The majority of the learning across the different Key Stages will be based upon the topic of the Olympics and will involve using the following skills:

Milepost 3 (Years 5 and 6)-Olympics: Success with Silver


The big idea

Milepost 4 (Years 7 and 9)-Going for Gold


The big idea

Snack Time / Lunch Time

Children are expected to bring their own snack. However, lunch is provided at school each day. Please pack a healthy mid-morning snack and a drink. It is essential that children have plenty of water to drink, so a personal refillable bottle is needed.

What to Wear

Children should wear casual, light summer clothes and light shoes. No additional indoor shoes are needed. Please label all items of clothing.

At the Primary site, every Monday, please make sure your child brings a swimsuit, towel and appropriate wet footwear (Crocs, flip flops, water shoes). Goggles are optional. These will be returned each night for washing.

Lost and Found Items

Please make sure personal belongings are named. At the end of Summer School, we will display any lost and found items. Please understand that any leftover items not claimed will be disposed of.


Parking

At the Primary site, please use the car park to park your vehicle when picking up your child. You will need to pick up your child from the cafeteria and sign them out with your class teacher. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

Fees

All fees must be paid prior to attending the Summer School. These can be paid in cash to the school office or via a bank transfer. Further details can be found on the application form. The fees are structured as follows:

Total Cost- 5,000 BHT including all tuition, lesson resources, activities, snacks/lunch for non Lanna students and **15,000 BHT** for Non Lanna students.





Summer School Covid-19 measures

Our aim is to create the safest, healthiest and lowest risk environment for the resumption of face-to-face teaching and learning. As such, Lanna International School complies with the strict guidelines set by OPEC which includes

- Allow for flexible timetables to ensure social distancing
- Create a workplace environment where staff can monitor wellbeing and take immediate sick leave if unwell.
- Students must check temperature and flu-like symptoms at home before school. Family members should also monitor their health similarly.
- Wash hands frequently; when you first arrive at school, before entering classrooms each time from outside, before and after lunch (or snack), after using washrooms.
- Clean frequently with disinfectant any common use materials, tools and devices, wash hands before and after touching common use materials.
- All classrooms must be sprayed with disinfectant after each use (specialist areas)
- All students, teachers, and staff must wear a mask at all times.
- Children must not share any resources whilst at school e.g. Laptops, Chromebooks, tablets must be wiped down after each use.
- Library books must be returned to the box outside the library and kept there for three days before being disinfected and sanitized.
- Have open ventilation passing through classrooms (at least 2 different directions)
- Have AC units running for no longer than 2 hours in a classroom before ventilating
- Students' seats should be 1~2 m apart. They cannot sit directly opposite each other.
- Music: No singing. All instruments must be wiped down and cleaned after each use.
- PE: No sports that involves body contact between students
